Baptism Preparation Classes

All parents wishing to have a child baptized at St. Lucy's must attend a Baptism Preparation Class before making an arrangement to choose a date for the baptism. We strongly encourage both parents to attend one of the classes before the birth of the baby.

The class will be held on Sunday evenings once a month (usually the first Sunday of the month) at 6:30pm in the church. The next class offered will be February 7th. The Baptismal Fee of \$25.00 should be paid when attending the class. Please call Sandy Gottfredsen to register for the class (554-1801, ext. 208).

Please keep in mind when choosing godparents, one sponsor must be a baptized, confirmed, practicing Catholic and it is required that the Sponsor Form be signed and approved by the parish at which the sponsor is currently registered. The sponsor form should be returned to the Parish Office at St. Lucy's at least two weeks prior to the baptism date. Call Sandy Gottfredsen at 554-1801, ext. 208, to make arrangements for a date after taking the class.

Baptism of the Lord

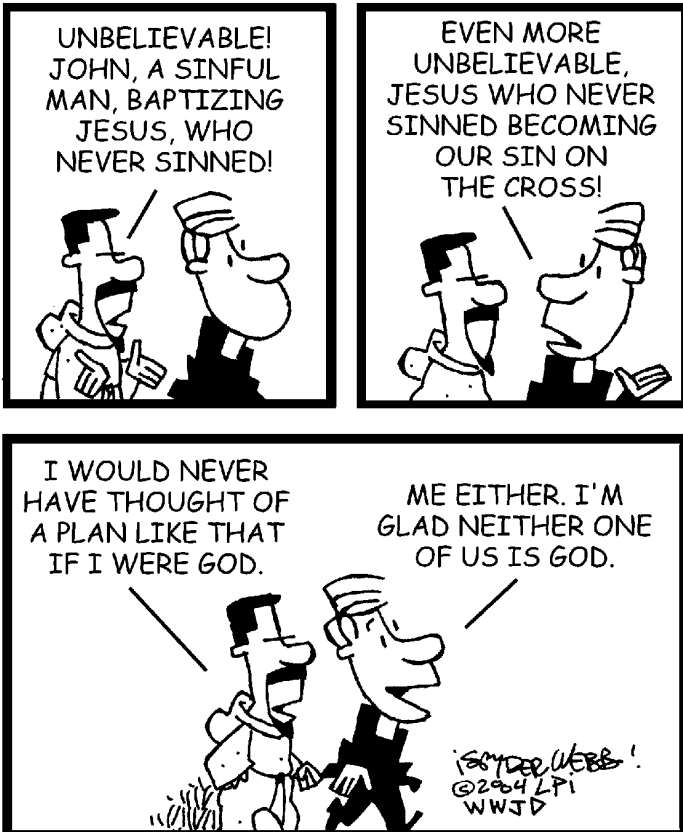
The old African-American spiritual "Michael Row the Boat Ashore" has one verse that goes, "Jordan's river is chilly and cold / hallelujah / chills the body but not the soul / hallelujah." We don't know what the temperature of the Jordan River was when Jesus stepped into it in front of the Baptist. But Luke's Gospel relates that after he had been baptized and while he was praying the heavens opened up and the Holy Spirit descended upon him. A voice from heaven was heard, saying, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

It is unlikely that any such explicitly miraculous events occurred at our own baptism, or any that we may have attended. But something just as momentous did take place when we were baptized. In our baptism we became intimately connected to God; we became God's own children, just as Jesus is the Father's beloved Son. And when we were baptized the Holy Spirit descended upon us-not as a dove, but as the Spirit of God that always dwells in our hearts. That connectedness to God never disappears. Even when we are guilty of the worst sins, God is with us. We believe that the Holy Spirit dwells in us, helping us to act more and more like Christ as we reaffirm our baptismal commitment.

While we celebrate the signs and wonders at the Jordan that herald Jesus' baptism and the beginning of his public ministry, we also recall that our own baptism begins the call to minister in this world. Our baptismal call is to act like Christ, to be his hands, and voice, and heart in this world. When we act like him, we can be assured we too will hear the Father's voice, "with you I am well pleased."
