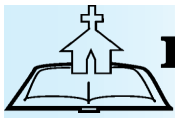

WHAT'S GOING ON AT ST. LUCY'S & ST. LUCY'S PARISH SCHOOL?



From the Associate Pastor

Pope Saint Gregory the Great (c. 540 – 12 March 604). Gregory grew up in a patrician family which produced two other popes (Felix III and Agapetus). Being destined for public office, he received an excellent education, especially in law. Having entered the civil service, Gregory became the prefect of Rome and presided over the Roman Senate. After the death of his father, Gregory became a monk in the Roman Monastery of St. Andrew; a calling he had put off for many years. There he rigorously observed the Benedictine Rule, which he did throughout his life. He was eventually ordained a deacon in order to be a papal representative at the Byzantine Court. It was in Constantinople where Gregory gave numerous conferences to the monks which were later developed into his largest work on morality called *Moralia*. Eventually he was recalled to Rome in order to be a counselor to Pope Pelagius II. Upon the death of Pelagius, Gregory was elected to be Pope. He tried to avoid it, but eventually acceded to the wish of the electors and was consecrated on September 3, 590. As Pope he continued his work on behalf of the poor of the city. He was also involved in civil government and in the spiritual affairs of the Church. Gregory believed in evangelization through monasticism. It was he who sent Augustine and his monks to evangelize England. Gregory's work in civil service paid off when he had to deal with numerous issues. He helped ward off the Lombards in the North while maintaining connections with the Emperor in the East. It was in dealing with the Lombards that he saved Italy and won the peoples affection. As a result, the people saw the Pope as their true protector since the civil government failed them. This would eventually lead to the development of the Papal States. He was a bridge to repairing schisms within Christendom both in the East and West. He was tireless and energetic in matters relating to the internal affairs of the Church, providing a model for his bishops. He also enforced clerical celibacy and was an outstanding moral teacher of his time. Besides these activities he took a personal interest in the development of the liturgy. It was Gregory who ordered that the Kyrie be sung alternately by clergy and laity. He decreed that the Alleluia be used throughout the year except on penitential days. He limited the deacons to singing the Gospel and stressed the importance of a homily. The present location of the Our Father was also his work. Finally, he is responsible for composing many of the prayer texts for Christmas, Epiphany, Easter and the Ascension. As we begin to prepare for the upcoming changes in the liturgy starting in Advent, let us pray that, through the intercession of Pope Saint Gregory the Great, we will have a smooth transition and find ourselves more connected to Our Lord because of it.

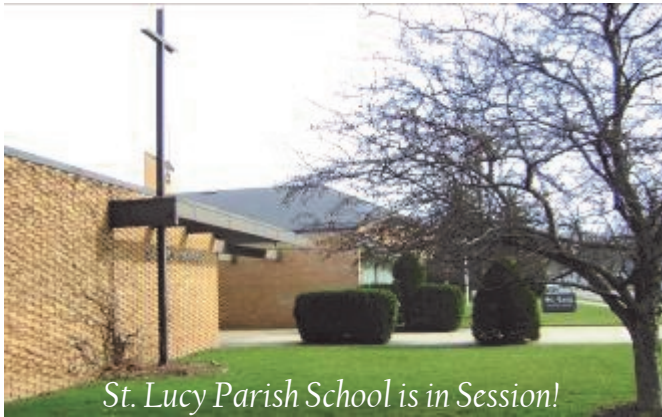
