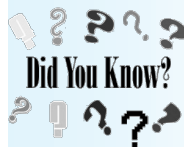

Festival Results (WOW)

Thanks to your tremendous support (financial and volunteer), great Co-Chairs and Area Chairs, a very supportive community and fantastic weather provided by the Good Lord, we were able to achieve what I believe is an all time record profit for our Festival. We earned \$80,092 this year. This is really a GREAT accomplishment and so very important to the Parish and School.

We used an anticipated profit of \$60,000 for this year's budget. We purposely budget only a portion of what we hope to make in case we encounter bad weather, low crowds, etc. A portion of the amount over \$60,000 will be used for special projects and the balance set aside to help offset emergency repairs, fill funding gaps, etc.

Without our Festival, we would find ourselves in quite a financial dilemma. While things are always tight, this at least keeps us in a position to maneuver through. Your support year after year after year is a true testament to the great family we are here at St. Lucy. On behalf of Father Mark, Father Sean, and everyone on the Festival Committee thanks again for stepping up for St. Lucy Parish and School.

Religious Education

Having children is a huge responsibility. It is a wonderful gift from God. The Bible, on the other hand, provides parents with reliable counsel on what to teach their children and practical directions on how to teach them. Parents need to find a way to talk about God each day to their children, as the Bible states in the Book of Deuteronomy.

"Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength.

Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today. Drill them into your children. Speak of them at home and abroad, whether you are busy or at rest. Bind them at your wrist as a sign and let them be as a pendant on your forehead."

Deuteronomy 4: 6 -8

- Teach like Jesus taught. Use stories and examples. Listen intently to your children and let them know you really are interested in their thoughts and feelings.
- Be patient with your children!
- Teach by example. When you teach your children to obey the Ten Commandments then it is expected that you obey them. A child who is taught not to steal, and sees a parent taking something that doesn't belong to him, will learn to do what the parent does. Children learn more from what you do, than what you say.
- Start while the child is YOUNG. By the time children reach five years old, they already have learned to imitate you: your sayings, your gestures, your attitudes, your mannerisms, and your beliefs.
- Religion classes for your children, CCD and Sunday School are here to assist in the teaching of the faith, but it will never replace the importance of parental teaching.

CCD for children in grades 1- 8 will begin September 28th. Sunday School for children who are 3, 4 and 5 years of age will start on October 2nd. There is still time to enroll your children. All registration forms are located at the kiosk in the narthex.
