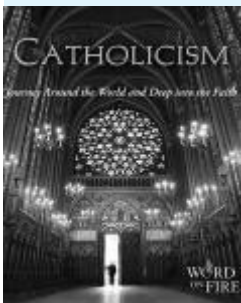

I can recall in my junior year of high school how important Confirmation was to me. Growing up at Mary Queen of Heaven parish in West Allis, I had always been involved with parish activities. Often, when looking back, I can recall it was my mother who encouraged me to volunteer for things around our parish. Confirmation seemed to change all that; it was my decision to make as an adult member of the Catholic faith.



Back in 1996, the bishops never really came around for Confirmation like they do now. Archbishop Weakland had granted permission to our parish priests to confirm us. I remember meeting our pastor at the time, Fr. Bill Kohler, who explained how the Holy Spirit will pour forth new gifts upon us, and how our faith from the time of our baptism on is confirmed and recognized before all in the parish. He would also joke around and say he still wanted me to serve Mass after Confirmation, despite the fact that I was much taller than him.

On my Confirmation day, I can remember my good friend Mike presenting me before the parish to my associate pastor at the time, Fr. Michael Merkt, who anointed my forehead with Chrism. I remember the great sense of peace that came from receiving the sacrament.

From that day forward, I took new initiatives on my own to be more engaged at the parish. I read at Mass, joined the choir, and helped with the festival, just to name a few. I also took more responsibility by being a Godfather for my friend Mike's son.

I believe that the gifts of the Holy Spirit given to me at Confirmation are what also helped me to think about priesthood and the call that I had felt already at that time. Confirmation was a sacrament that set me apart as a full member of the Catholic faith.

As many of our sons and daughters of the parish were confirmed this past Friday, February 3, I wish to congratulate them in their decision to respond to this sacrament, and I would like to thank their families as well in preparing them throughout their whole life. Now that you have been confirmed, don't keep the gifts of the Spirit buried like the talents given to the man in the Gospel, but rather utilize them for the good of Christ and His Church.
