## DISCUSS

If you have a personal relationship with Christ, share with your teen about how that relationship came to be, and why you decided the cost of following Christ was worth it. Ask your teen:

- How have you felt God call you to greatness?
- >> How do you feel about discipleship?
- Does anything about discipleship worry you?
- >> What are the benefits of discipleship?

In the small group session the teens were challenged to grow in the habits of the saints. H.A.B.I.T.S is an acronym.

- H holy hour (committing to daily prayer)
- A accountability (inviting close friends to keep you accountable to growing as a disciple of Jesus)
- B bible (meditating, studying, and memorizing scripture)
- I invest in your parish (tithing and serving in the mission of the parish)
- T tell (don't be afraid to tell others about your faith and invite them to faith in Jesus)
- S sacraments (we receive grace in the sacraments to grow as a disciple. Frequent eucharist and confession strengthen us.

If your teen witnesses your efforts to grow in these h.a.b.i.t.s they will be inspired to grow. Going forward, ask you teen periodically how their h.a.b.i.t.s. are coming.



**PARENT TIP:** Consider praying the rosary as a family in the evening whether it is just a decade or all 5 decades. Before each Hail Mary, take turns naming a person you would like to pray for.

This week your teen was asked to commit to praying with Scripture and to praying the *Suscipe*, written by St. Ignatius of Loyola, (found on the following page).
